Morning & After School Care Program

Our Morning & Afterschool Care program is open for kindergarten to grade 7 students within our school.

There are 24 spaces available with a ratio of 1 staff member for every 12 children. Our program will provide a beginning and continuation of care for your child before and following their school day. This will include an opportunity for relaxation and dynamic play. Students will have a chance to eat their self-provided afterschool snacks and will be given an opportunity to do quiet activities such as reading, a craft and homework.

Morning School Care: 7:00 am - 8:30 am Afterschool Care: 2:45 pm - 5:45 pm.

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Character Day Parade

We are excited to announce that this year for Halloween, Notre Dame is once again hosting "Dress like your favourite Character" on Tuesday, October 31. On this day, students are invited to come to school dressed up as characters from a favourite book, movie, or show. There is no need to go out and buy a character costume; instead, students are encouraged to gather an assortment of hats, clothing, signs, or other props to create a homemade costume.

For example, to dress like Pippi Longstocking, wear pigtails and long striped socks, or wear jeans with a red and white striped shirt like Waldo.

We will offer an outside parade around the playground if the weather permits. Parents are welcome to come to watch on the playground at 1:00 pm.

To support students' feelings of safety and security in our building, violent or frightening costumes such as villains or monsters will not be considered acceptable. Additionally, no weapons or dangerous-looking items will be permitted to accompany an outfit. This means students are welcome to dress up as characters like Luke Skywalker, Batman, etc., as long as they do not bring any of their weapon-like accessories.



Emergency Preparedness

In keeping all students and staff safe, the Ministry of Education requires us to practice various emergency drills throughout the school year. These drill practices include six fire drills, three earthquake drills and two lockdown drills.

Teachers have been reviewing and practicing with the students what to do in the case of a fire, earthquake and lockdown. Throughout October, we will be practicing these drills. We do ask that you please remind your child(ren) that they, the students, are safe during these emergency practices and that we practice for all our safety.

Allergy 'Aware' School

Notre Dame School is "Allergy Aware". Please check with your child's classroom teacher for allergy alerts. Consider peanut/nut alternatives for individual student lunches and snacks out of consideration to our students and staff with food sensitivities/allergies. Students are reminded that snacks and lunch are to be eaten in the classroom. We cannot eat recess snack or lunch on the playground for safety reasons such as allergies.

Student Safety

Cross Walk Safety:

Students are encouraged to cross the road using the cross walk for safety. A crossing guard is paid and hired by the school for student safety.



Parking Lot Safety:

The Notre Dame Staff Parking will be closed at the beginning and end of each day for student safety. Please park along the road and walk to the gates or have your child meet you at the sidewalk. Thank you for your support in keeping our students safe.



School Absences:

Please contact the school office though email, a written note or call (250-782-4923) if your child will not be at school or will be arriving late. We would appreciate it if you could call in absences before 9 am. This is a safety issue. When a child is not at school and there has been no call in from parents, the school will call you to make sure that your child is home safe with you. It is our responsibility to locate your child as soon as possible.

As well, numerous unexplained absences throughout the year place our school funding in jeopardy.

Absentee notes are important to our school funding!
