IN THE CLASSROOM

ELA:

- I can listen to a story with attention and focus.
- I can identify and discuss key characters and events.
- I can identify the initial sounds in words (e.g., "I can tell you the first sound in 'cat' is /k/")
- I can recognize and isolate ending sounds in words (e.g., "I can tell you the last sound in 'dog' is /g/")
- I can identify rhyming words (e.g., "I can tell you words that rhyme with 'cat,' like 'hat' and 'bat"")
- I can trace and write some uppercase and lowercase letters Math:
- I can count forward from 1–10
- I can count backward from 10-1
- I can use one-to-one correspondence to count objects, touching each one as I say the number
- I can represent numbers using physical objects, such as counting blocks or cubes
- I can instantly recognize the quantity of 1 or 2 objects without counting
- I can recognize numerals and know that they stand for numbers
- I can compare quantities using the terms more, fewer, same
- I can use objects or pictures to show how two groups of items can be combined to make a larger group
- I can use objects or pictures to demonstrate how items can be taken away or removed from a group.
- I can identify patterns in everyday objects, such as patterns in colors, shapes, or sounds
- I can use patterns to make predictions about what comes next in a sequence

Science:

- I can identify and name the four seasons: spring, summer, fall (autumn), and winter
- I can describe the characteristics and weather associated with fall
- I can observe and describe how plants and trees change with the seasons, such as leaves falling in the fall
- I can notice how animals adapt to the changing seasons, such as hibernation or migration

Christian Education:

- I can identify that God is our heavenly Father
- I know that God can speak to us through the Church, in the things he made, through those who care for us, and in our hearts
- I can talk to God through prayer
- I know that God protects us
- I can understand that baptism is a way to welcome people into God's family, the Church
