Learning Intentions:

Reading -

I can determine the importance of key details in a nonfiction text.

I can ask meaningful questions.

Writing -

I can use conventional spelling, capitalization, and punctuation.

I can use the English language creatively to write interesting complex sentences.

I can create a nonfiction text feature.

Speaking and Listening -

I can share my thinking and teach others.

I can demonstrate effective listening skills and questions.

Science -

I can identify heterogeneous mixtures, suspensions, emulsions, and other mixtures density and particle size. I can identify and explain Newton's three laws of motion.

Social Studies-

I can understand the different systems of government.

ADST-

I can learn the basics of food handling and simple preparation techniques and equipment used.

I can identify factors in ingredient use, including balanced eating/nutrition, function, and dietary restrictions.
