## SpacesEDU:

I am really enjoying sharing our learning with you via SpacesEDU. I hope it is promoting good conversation at home about school. Thank you for being respectful of others and keeping the pictures on SpacesEDU and not posting on social media.

## English Language Arts:

Students will continue to finish learning the Alphabet this term through Jolly Phonics. We will continue
with doing our daily shared reading, read alouds and rhyme time (Heggerty Phonemic Awareness). We
have also started this term, Moe the Mouse Speech and Language Development program that Aleana
Yu (Registered Speech-Language Pathologist) will be doing weekly with our class.

Our Learning Intentions for Reading, Writing and Speaking and Listening:

- I can identify and say the sounds in words
- I can recognize most letter-sound matches
- I can recognize and name most uppercase and lowercase letters
- I can understand that text is read from left and right and top to bottom
- I can identify the beginning, middle, and end of a story
- I can make guesses about what might happen next in a story
- I can recognize punctuation marks like periods and question marks
- I can understand that words and pictures in a book work together to tell a story
- I can use proper letter formation (verbal pathways) in my writing
  - \* Q= pull back around and cross
- I can use proper spacing between my letters (finger space)
- I can gain confidence in my writing skills as I practice and explore (writing the room)
- I can share my ideas with others
- I can be a respectful audience member
- I can ask questions that are related to the topic
- I can make personal connections to others

# Math:

Students will start the term with patterns, followed by Shapes and Objects and then measurement.

Our Learning Intentions for Math:

- I can recognize and create simple patterns using objects or shapes
- I can extend and continue a given pattern
- I can recognize the core of a pattern
- I can identify and name common 3D shapes like cubes, spheres, and cylinders
- I can sort 3D shapes based on their attributes
- I can recognize and name common 2D shapes like circles, squares, and triangles
- I can compare and order objects by size
- I can use tools like rulers or non-standard units to measure length
- I can understand and compare the capacity of different containers

#### Socials:

This term in Socials we are exploring Families and the theme 'All About Me'. Students will be discovering their roles and responsibilities within their families, we are fostering an understanding of the importance of families and learning to identify and appreciate the unique aspects of their individual identities.

Our Learning Intentions for Socials:

- I can understand and discuss the roles of family members in my life
- I can recognize and appreciate the unique qualities that make me who I am
- I can value the similarities and differences among my classmates and their families
- I can share and listen to stories about families, including traditions and special memories

## Arts Education:

This term we will be focusing on Music.

Our Learning Intentions for Music:

- I can clap along to basic rhythmic patterns in music
- I can identify pitch (how high or low a note is)
- I can recognize dynamics of music (loudness or softness)
- I can identify the tempo (frequency or speed of the beat)

### Allergy Aware:

Reminder that we are an Allergy Aware Classroom. This means that we have a student who cannot eat nuts. We have done a great job at remembering not to share food with anyone in the classroom. If you are bringing in treats for the class for a special occasion, please ensure that they are nut free so they can be enjoyed by everyone. As we are a Nut Safe classroom and that means foods that contains nuts are not allowed to be eaten by your child at lunch and snack. However, we have precautions in place to keep all students safe and teach the students safety as well.
