## 6. Old Business

6.1 Read-a-thon – The read-a-thon concluded with raising \$9,703.97 with a five-year total of \$52,670.47. It was discussed that enough money has been raised for level readers and the remaining money should be used to purchase intermediate chapter books for the library as this is an area the library is lacking. It was discussed to change the incentive next year so each class has an opportunity to win.

6.2 Shrove Tuesday – Pancakes and sausages day was a success. All the extra left overs donated and dropped off to our local shelter. The supplies used were as follows (so we have record for next year):
