## Allergy 'Aware' School



Notre Dame School is "Allergy Aware." In September, classroom teachers sent alerts about allergies in individual classrooms. We ask that you consider peanut/nut alternatives for individual student lunches and snacks out of consideration for our students and staff with food sensitivities/allergies.

Students are reminded that snacks and lunch are to be eaten in the classroom and that food is not shared. For safety reasons, such as allergies, we cannot eat recess snacks or lunch on the playground.

## **Student Safety is our #1 Priority**

#### Cross Walk Safety:

Students are encouraged to cross the road using the crosswalk for safety. A crossing guard is paid and hired by the school for student safety.

#### Parking Lot Safety:

For student safety, Notre Dame Staff Parking will be closed at the beginning and end of each day. Please park along the sidewalk in legal parking areas and walk to the gates, or have your child meet you at the sidewalk. Thank you for your support in keeping our students safe.



#### **School Absences:**

Please email, write a note, or call the school office (250-782-4923) if your child will not be at school or will be arriving late. We would appreciate it if you could call in absences before 9 a.m.

This is a **safety issue.** When a child is not at school and parents have not called, the school will call you to make sure that your child is home safe with you. It is our responsibility to locate your child as soon as possible.

Numerous unexplained absences throughout the year also jeopardize our school funding. Absentee notes are important to our school funding!
