### **Continuous Improvement Plan**

On July 1, independent schools across B.C. were required to develop a Continuous **Improvement Plan (CIP)** to support student learning and well-being. These plans focus on literacy, numeracy, and student wellness, ensuring schools are using data to celebrate successes and address emerging gaps.

Notre Dame's plan is built on five years of student data and identifies three focus goals: screening, literacy, and numeracy. Our results also showed that student well-being at Notre Dame is already strong and positive; while this is not a formal goal area for now, we will continue to gather information and monitor this important part of student life.

Our full plan will be shared with families on our school website in early October. We look forward to working together in this ongoing cycle of growth to best support our students.



# **Character Day Parade** Friday, Oct. 31st

We are excited to announce that on **Friday, October 31**, Notre Dame will once again host our annual *Dress Like* Your Favourite Character Day! Students are invited to dress up as a character from a favourite book, movie, or show. ## Important Guidelines for Costumes

### To support this:

No weapons or look-alike weapons are allowed (e.g., lightsabers, toy guns, swords). Characters such as Batman or Luke Skywalker are welcome—just without weapon accessories.

Students are encouraged to choose characters that celebrate imagination, fun, and kindness.


Great examples: Fancy Nancy, Cinderella, Snow White, Superman, Spiderman, Waldo

# Morning & After School Care - Spaces are still Available -

Our Morning & after-school care program is available for kindergarten to grade 7 students within our school.

There are 24 spaces available with a ratio of 1 staff member for every 12 children. Our program will provide a beginning and continuation of care for your child before and after their school day. This will include an opportunity for relaxation and dynamic play. Students will have a chance to eat their self-provided afterschool snacks and be allowed to do quiet activities such as reading, a craft and homework.

### **Hours of operation**

Morning School Care: 7:30 am – 8:30 am Afterschool Care: 2:45 pm – 5:45 pm.



**Applications** for the Morning & After-school Care Program can be found on our school website or at the school office. If we have space, drop-in days are available. Please note that drop days are for random times when a family will need childcare. Drop-in day fees are for drop-ins only. This means if your child attends on a regular schedule, our monthly fees apply.



# Allergy 'Aware' School



Notre Dame School is "Allergy Aware". Please check with your child's classroom teacher for allergy alerts. Consider peanut/nut alternatives for individual student lunches and snacks out of consideration to our students and staff with food sensitivities/allergies. Students are reminded that snacks and lunch are to be eaten in the classroom. We cannot eat recess snack or lunch on the playground for safety reasons such as allergies.

## Student Safety is our #1 Priority

### **Cross Walk Safety:**

Students are encouraged to cross the road using the crosswalk for safety. A crossing guard is paid and hired by the school for student safety.

### Parking Lot Safety:

For student safety, Notre Dame Staff Parking will be closed at the beginning and end of each day. Please park along the sidewalk in legal parking areas and walk to the gates, or have your child meet you at the sidewalk. Thank you for your support in keeping our students safe.



#### **School Absences:**

Please email, write a note, or call the school office (250-782-4923) if your child will not be at school or will be arriving late. We would appreciate it if you could call in absences before 9 a.m.

This is a **safety issue.** When a child is not at school and parents have not called, the school will call you to make sure that your child is home safe with you. It is our responsibility to locate your child as soon as possible.

Numerous unexplained absences throughout the year also jeopardize our school funding. Absentee notes are important to our school funding!
