🙏 Faith & Virtue Focus

One of the central goals of Catholic education is to help children draw nearer to Jesus. At Notre Dame, we continue this mission through the *Virtues in Practice* program, with this year's focus on the *Fruits of the Holy Spirit*. From Kindergarten to Grade Seven, our students will be guided to imitate Christ by practicing the virtues that reflect His life and love. Each month, our school community will focus on one virtue and one Fruit of the Spirit, recognizing how these gifts grow within us when we live according to God's will. By doing so, we nurture qualities that help our children become compassionate, faith-filled, and Christ-centred individuals.

The purpose of continuing with this virtue program is to invite students, staff, and families into a shared journey of knowing, valuing, and practicing the virtues with consistency and intention. Virtue calls us to make a conscious choice to do what is right, to give generously of ourselves, and to act with integrity for the good of others. Students will have daily opportunities to put these virtues into practice, shaping habits that will strengthen their faith and character for a lifetime.

Each month, we will celebrate and acknowledge students and staff who have demonstrated virtue in action. By the end of the school year, every community member will have been recognized for living out the virtues in meaningful ways.

This year is especially meaningful as we enter our three-year theme's third and final year: "Living, Celebrating, and Proclaiming our Faith." Over the past two years, we have learned to live our faith more deeply and to celebrate it joyfully as a community. Now, we take the next step—proclaiming our faith through our words, actions, and witness to others. Beginning in September with the virtue of Hospitality— "making people feel welcome and showing kindness to those who are new or visiting"—we commit ourselves to living the virtues in ways that clearly share Christ's love. As we bring this theme to its completion, may our growth in virtue leave a lasting mark, helping us be joyful witnesses who proclaim the Good News in all that we do.

Morning & After School Care

Our Morning & after-school care program is available for kindergarten to grade 7 students within our school.

There are 24 spaces available with a ratio of 1 staff member for every 12 children. Our program will provide a beginning and continuation of care for your child before and after their school day. This will include an opportunity for relaxation and dynamic play. Students will have a chance to eat their self-provided afterschool snacks and be allowed to do quiet activities such as reading, a craft and homework.

Hours of operation

Morning School Care: 7:30 am – 8:30 am Afterschool Care: 2:45 pm – 5:45 pm.



Applications for the Morning & After-school Care Program can be found on our school website or at the school office. If we have space, drop-in days are available. Please note that drop days are for random times when a family will need childcare. Drop-in day fees are for drop-ins only. This means if your child attends on a regular schedule, our monthly fees apply.

Notre Dame Student/Family Handbook

Parent Volunteers

Volunteers are necessary and welcomed within the school in various ways: as classroom helpers, for hot lunches, for field trips, for fundraising, and as supervisors of small groups of students for field trips. All volunteers must complete the CISPG volunteer application form (available at the school office and included in the student application form), sign the confidentiality form, and submit a Criminal Record Check.

Criminal record checks are completed through the RCMP (forms can be found in the office). This takes time, so if interested, fill out the forms at the beginning of the school year. It is a good idea to check each year to see if you are required to do the process again, as these must be done every three

Allergy 'Aware' School



Notre Dame School is "Allergy Aware". Please check with your child's classroom teacher for allergy alerts. Consider peanut/nut alternatives for individual student lunches and snacks out of consideration to our students and staff with food sensitivities/allergies. Students are reminded that snacks and lunch are to be eaten in the classroom. We cannot eat recess snack or lunch on the playground for safety reasons such as allergies.

Student Safety is our #1 Priority

Cross Walk Safety

Students are encouraged to cross the road **using the crosswalk** for safety. A crossing guard is paid and hired by the school for student safety.

Parking Lot Safety:

Notre Dame Staff Parking will be closed at the beginning and end of each day for student safety.

Please park along the sidewalk in legal parking areas and walk to the gates, or have your child meet you at the sidewalk. Thank you for your support in keeping our students safe.



School Absences:

Please contact the school office through email, a written note or call (250-782-4923) if your child will not be at school or will be arriving late. We would appreciate it if you could call in absences before 9 am. This is a safety issue. When a child is not at school and there has been no call in from parents, the school will call you to make sure that your child is home safe with you. It is our responsibility to locate your chapter oon as possible.

As well, numerous unexplained absences throughout the year place our school funding in jeopardy. Absentee notes are important to our school funding!
