**Grade 2 Term 2 Newsletter**



Dear Families,

I hope everyone had a wonderful and relaxing winter holiday. It is so exciting to be back in our building with the students! This term tends to fly by, so we are already working hard on our second-term curriculum. Here is what we will be focusing on this term.

#### **English Language Arts:**

- I can use UFLI to help me spell and read words with long vowels and other vowel teams.
- I can state my opinion and use evidence (reasons) to support it.
- I can use compound sentences with joining words (so, and, because, and for) in my writing.
- I can use reading strategies to help me read and make it sound like talking.
- I can participate in group discussions and practice retelling the story to help me understand the text.

#### **Mathematics:**

- I can add and subtract numbers to 50 with and without regrouping using a variety of strategies.
- I can add three 1-digit numbers.
- I can solve real-world problems and show my thinking.
- I can get ready for multiplication by making equal groups.

#### **Social Studies:**

- I can explain a “tradition” and why it is “significant.”
- I can identify aspects of culture that are similar and different from my own.

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Mrs. Juell will continue to use the Alive in Christ manual and FORMED (Catholic faith website) to guide our **Christian Education** learning and prepare us for Mass and Prayer services. Grade 2 will organize and conduct the **Prayer service** on **February 20, 2026** within the Notre Dame gym at 9:00. **The Grade 2 Mass is on April 10, 2026**, after we return from Spring Break.
